

Set.

Set your camera to the local date and time. Turn on GPS if you've got it!

Shoot.


Capture as many photos as you can clearly showing the tail's flukes.



3

Submit.

Go to happywhale.com and upload <u>all</u> tail shots for each whale. If you are a new contributor, your account will auto-generate.



How Do You Identify Humpbacks? Individuals are identified by the shape and markings on the two flukes, or lobes, of their tail. These markings are visible when a humpback dives and tail rises above the water. The best ID photos show all parts of the fluke clearly, including the tips, leading edge and central notch.

How Will My Photos Be Used? Photos are used to identify individual whales and track the health and movements of whale populations worldwide. There is still so much to learn about humpback whales and their patterns of migration over time. What stories will your photos tell?
