Description

TOPOGRAPHY

This island is around 1.2km long. From the cobbled beach on the eastern coast, smooth rock terraces slope gently upwards towards a large crevassed ice-cap, which covers the western two-thirds of the island.

FAUNA

Leopard seal - Seen off-shore, Weddell seal - Regularly haul out, Southern elephant seal - Regularly haul out, South Polar Skua - Confirmed breeders, Kelp gull - Confirmed breeders, Gentoo penguin - Confirmed breeders, Blue-eyed shag - Confirmed breeders, Antarctic tern - Confirmed breeders

FLORA

Swards of moss species, Caloplaca spp. and other lichens, the green alga Prasiola crispa and snow algae.

Disturbance of wildlife and trampling of vegetation.

All visits are to be conducted in accordance with the General Guidelines for Visitors to the Antarctic. Be sensitive to terms nesting sites, which may extend beyond the limits shown on the map for Closed Area A.

CAUTIONARY NOTES

The ice cap is likely to be crevassed and should only be visited with appropriately qualified guides and suitable equipment.
